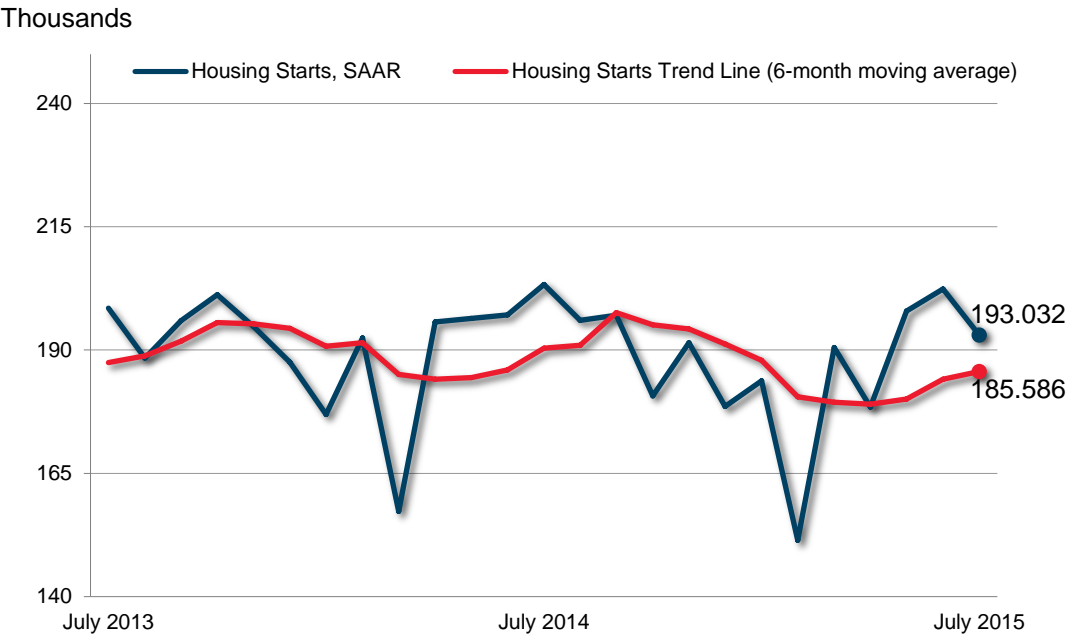

<sup>1</sup>The trend is a six-month moving average of the monthly seasonally adjusted annual rates (SAAR). By removing seasonal ups and downs, seasonal figures at annual rates indicates the annual level of starts that would be obtained if the monthly pace was maintained for 12 months.

<sup>2</sup> CMHC estimates the level of starts in centres with a population of less than 10,000 for each of the three months of the quarter, at the beginning of each quarter. During the last month of the quarter, CMHC conducts the survey in these centres and revises the estimate.

<sup>3</sup>Urban centres with a population of 10,000 and over.
