





APPROVAL OF TECH IN THE CLASSROOM






84% of teachers reported that the use of technology leads to higher student engagement with lesson plans.


78% of teachers believe technology enables students to learn more effectively.





The majority of teachers and parents agree that technology is leading us to discover better learning models.








