## Canada and New Brunswick reach agreement under new federal infrastructure funding programs

Canada and New Brunswick have approved 51 community infrastructure projects to date under two new federal infrastructure programs introduced as part of Phase 1 of the 10-year *Investing in Canada* plan. The Clean Water and Wastewater Fund and the Public Transit Infrastructure Fund will address key infrastructure priorities with a focus on repairing and upgrading existing facilities and assets.

Additional projects will be prioritized by the province for funding under these programs in the coming months.

## **Clean Water and Wastewater Fund**

The Government of Canada is providing \$39,717,426 and the Government of New Brunswick is providing \$19,858,713 for 47 projects to rehabilitate and improve community water and wastewater systems across the province. Combined with municipal contributions, \$79,434,852 will be going towards providing New Brunswick families with clean reliable water and wastewater services.
