By the numbers: Facts and Figures

Total of gift from David P. Werklund: \$25 million

\$15 million will be placed in an endowment to support awards and educational initiatives, including:

- Six undergraduate student community engaged leadership awards beginning in 2013-14 (\$10,000 per year per student for two years of Bachelor of Education program)
- Two Doctoral Fellowships per year, to begin in 2014-15
- Postdoctoral Fellowship, one per year, to begin in 2014-15
- Teaching and Research excellence awards, to begin in 2013-14 (\$10,000 awarded per year)
- Three Research Professorships, each for a three-year term, to begin in 2014-15
- Student Activities Fund in support of undergraduate and graduate initiatives, to provide funding for compelling and relevant learning opportunities, to begin in 2014-15 (\$25,000, growing to \$50,00 per year once endowment is complete)
- Teaching Innovation Fund to support excellence in education, to begin in 2014-15 (\$25,000, growing to \$50,00 per year once endowment is complete)
- Werklund Excellence fund in support of emerging opportunities that will keep the Werklund School of Education at the top of the field: amounts to be determined as opportunities arise

\$10 million will fund initiatives for the next five years, including:

- Upgrades to physical infrastructure of Education Complex to enhance teaching and research space: \$5.8 million
- Research investments in professorial staff beginning in 2013-14
