## RE: Insite - Vancouver's Supervised Injection Facility

As you are aware, addiction continues to be a serious health-related matter in Canada. There is now a growing consensus indicating that the harms of addiction should be addressed using a variety of means including evidence based health-focused policies and programs.

The evidence generated to date indicates strongly that supervised injection facilities play an important role within a comprehensive drug policy response. There is now a large body of peer-reviewed scientific evidence speaking to the benefits of Insite, Canada's only supervised injection facility. This body of evidence has also ruled out potential harmful effects of this innovative initiative.

In light of the available evidence, and the ongoing and severe harms associated with addiction in Canada, we urge you to support the application of evidence-based interventions by allowing Insite to continue to operate and continue to serve some of Canada's most marginalized and severely addicted citizens.


