

# Monster.ca "If I were CEO" Survey -Summary of Results-

## Who do you imagine would be the ultimate CEO to work for?

- More than one-quarter of Canadians (28%) chose Barack Obama as the ultimate CEO.
  - Not surprisingly, Obama was the most popular with the 18-34 crowd, at 32%.
  - Obama was least popular in Alberta, clocking in with just 18%.
  - He was the most popular in Quebec, at 37%.
- The "current boss" was the choice of 16% of Canadians.
  - This choice was the most popular on the Prairies at 25%.
- Five per cent of Canadians chose Donald Trump as the CEO they'd most like to work for.
  - The Donald was slightly more popular in Ontario and Alberta, both at 6%.
- From opposite ends of the celebrity spectrum Don Cherry and David Suzuki each garnered 11% of the vote, as did Captain Kirk, William Shatner.
  - David Suzuki was the most popular in Atlantic Canada at 16% and the least popular on the Prairies at 5%.
  - o Don Cherry was the most popular in Alberta at 18% and the least popular in Quebec at 6%.
  - Captain Kirk was less popular with women (7%) than men (14%).
- Only 3% of Canadians chose the Queen as the ultimate CEO but she beat out Prime Minster Stephen Harper, who earned just 2% of the vote.
- From the write-in category, other prospective CEOs Canadians would like to work for included:

## If you could give one piece of advice to your current CEO, what would it be?

- One third of Canadians (33%), recommend that the CEO should "spend time in the trenches" getting to know what employees do day-to-day.
  - This idea was the most popular on the Prairies at 36%.
- A further 17% of Canadians recommended that the CEO should live on an average employee's pay cheque for a month.
  - Men were more likely, at 19%, than women (15%) to recommend the temporary CEO pay cut.
  - The Quebecois were less likely to think the CEO needed a paycheque reality check at 11% versus English Canadians at 18%.
- Employees didn't want to get too close to the big boss, with just 9% nationwide thinking the CEO should be having lunch with employees at least once a month.

- This idea was particularly unpopular on the Prairies where just 4% thought lunching with the CEO made sense.
- The idea was the most popular in Quebec, where 12% of employees thought the CEO should lunch with employees at least once a month.

\*Respondents were asked to select their priorities for what they would do if they were CEO by rating thirteen statements, using a scale where zero meant "it is not a priority" and 100 meant "it is high priority"

#### Methodology

From September 29<sup>th</sup> to October 4<sup>th</sup> 2010, Angus Reid Public Opinion conducted an online survey among a randomly selected, representative sample of **2,009 employed adult Canadians** who are Angus Reid Forum panel members. The margin of error is  $\pm 2.2\%$ , 19 times out of 20. The results have been statistically weighted to ensure a representative sample. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding.

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
